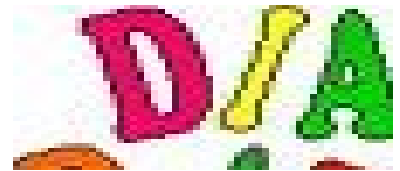

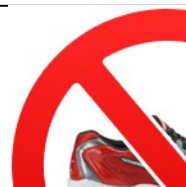


SCHOOL COUNCIL
