## WORLD BOOK DAY

World Book Day is on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> March and it is time to dress up! This may be in the form of a favourite character outfit, or a picture of a book attached to a T-shirt, or perhaps even a hat!! The more imaginative, the better!!

The book fair arrives in time for the day and all pupils will have a chance to visit the fair. It will be open after school from Friday 6<sup>th</sup> March until Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> March.

All pupils will receive a £1.00 World Book Day Token which can be used against a £2.99 (or more) book, at the book fair. Alternatively, there are some special World Book Day books which can be exchanged for the token. These are available at local book stores.

As part of our celebrations for World Book Day, children will be working on wordless books and will have the opportunity to share their work with children from other classes in the near future.

For World Book Day, we would like your child to make a 'Book in a Bottle'. This requires them to clean out and dry a clear plastic (**not glass**) bottle/jar. Inside, place items or pictures that represent a favourite book. For example:

**Favourite book:** Harry Potter. **Items in bottle:** a small broom, a witch's hat and a scar - all made in different materials.

**Favourite book:** The Hungry Caterpillar. **Items in a bottle:** some plastic fruits, a caterpillar and a butterfly!

**Favourite book:** Gangsta Granny. **Items in a bottle:** stolen jewels, a scooter, ballroom dress and a plumbing magazine!

Perhaps the bottle could have a tag around the lid, which names the book and explains the items. These will be displayed on World Book Day.

One creative winner from each class will receive a certificate and a book of their choice from the book fair.
