Savannah 5W

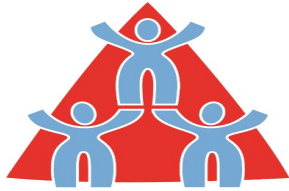
For adopting a 'can do' attitude in maths this week, proving her own ability to herself as she mastered long multiplication and short division

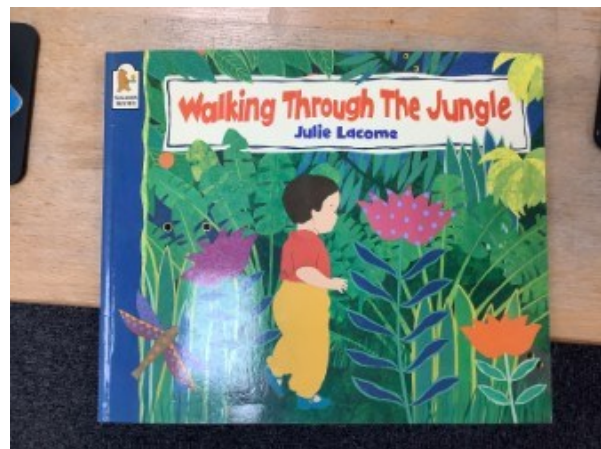
Thank you to all the parents who came to the **Year 1** Reading Meeting. The next session will be on Thursday 13th March for those who couldn't stay.
