For using his fantastic imagination and engineering skills to independently design and construct his own fully functioning marble track this week. It was impressive to see his focus and effort to complete this challenge

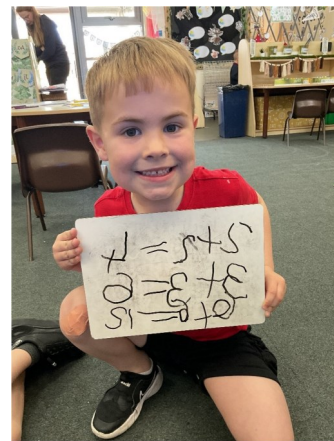
