Laura 6F

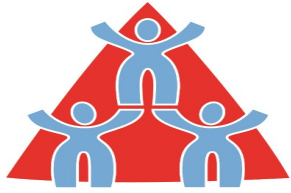
For the consistency of her quiet, relentless attitude to working hard and giving her best

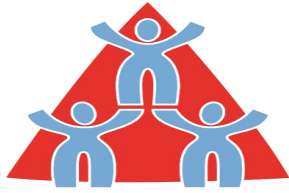
Y1
